DEAR FRIENDS.

Even if the election results (in Germany) in the capital city (Berlin) are somewhat consoling with a majority for the Die Linke party and its four direct mandates, 23 February 2025 brings with it a drastic shift towards racist agitation, deprivation of rights and exclusion. The largely black-blue map represents a brutalisation of the migration regime at all levels. We must brace ourselves...



... and yet continue to resist. The We'll Come United network met one day before the federal election and a few days later - undeterred - issued the first call to organise a protest caravan. This is planned to take place from 20 to 27 September 2025, in particular in front of and against the camps, against racist discrimination and against deportations. There are still a few months to prepare this one week-long mobilisation. The protest caravan echoes the call we had already shared in the last Kompass: for a transnational chain of actions to mark the 10th anniversary of the summer of migration.

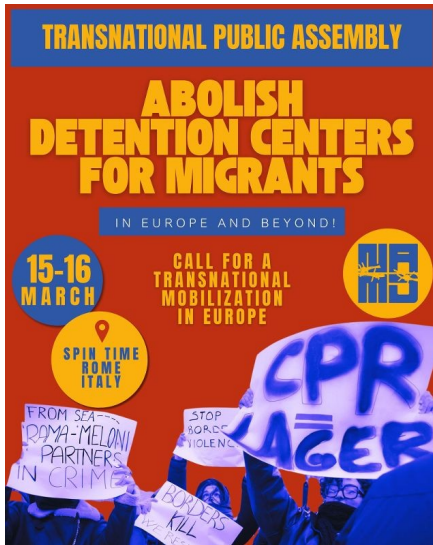
Five years have passed since a perpetrator murdered nine people in Hanau for racist reasons. Around 19 February 2025, there were memorial events in dozens of cities, while the failure of the authorities and the police, as well as the lack of investigations and the failure of politicians to take responsibility, once again received germanwide media attention. A few days earlier, the 19 February initiative, together with relatives from Hanau and victims from

15TH/16TH OF MARCH IN ROME: TRANSNATIONAL NETWORK MEETING AGAINST MIGRANT DETENTION



The Network Against Migrant Detention is a transnational coalition of activists calling for the abolition of administrative detention for migrants in Italy, Albania, across Europe and everywhere. We believe in the urgent need to build a broad collective movement capable of challenging all forms of administrative detention and the societal model it represents.

This purpose-driven coalition was established in Italy last year in response to the securitarian policies of the Meloni government. These policies include the reinforcement of detention centers for migrants and the Rama-Meloni Protocol, which initiated the construction of an Italian-run hotspot

and detention center on Albanian soil. This agreement, valid for five years, demands continued scrutiny and firm opposition as it seeks to become a precedent for similar models across Europe. (...) We invite you to a transnational public assembly to discuss and build a common mobilization in Europe. During the two-day event, we will also propose an action against administrative detention to denounce institutional violence and promote concrete alternatives.

politically challenging time in Europe, particularly in Germany. (The final destination is yet to be determined).

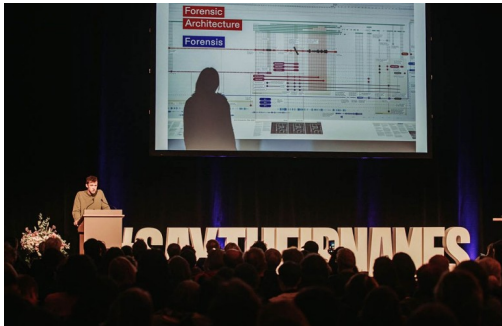
How You Can Help:

PRO ASYL: THE BITTER REALITY OF THE (AMPEL) COALITION

From a fresh start to sealing off: the bitter reality of the coalition's migration policy

A paradigm shift and a fresh start in asylum and migration policy were planned, and the coalition agreement of the Ampel government raised hopes. However, the government's time in office ended with deportations and tighter asylum laws, and only a few of the coalition agreement's proposals were implemented. A review.

‘We want to make a fresh start in migration and integration policy that does justice to a modern immigration country. To do that, we need a paradigm shift: we want to shape migration realistically and with foresight through active and regulatory policies.’ Page 110, coalition agreement of the Ampel government.

The new coalition government of SPD, Greens and FDP headed this chapter of its coalition agreement with these promising words, which were signed on 7 December 2021. Today, these sentences from the progressive agreement seem like something from another world.

There is no doubt that the coalition had a difficult start: no sooner had the coalition agreement been signed, Olaf Scholz elected as Chancellor, the ministers sworn in and the Christmas break over, than Russia invaded Ukraine on 24 February 2022. Millions of Ukrainians fled, with a million coming to Germany alone. In addition, the attack on Ukraine led to economic, security and energy policy challenges and geopolitical shifts that could not have been foreseen. All of this happened against the backdrop of the Taliban's takeover in Afghanistan shortly before the federal election.

Although these world political events show how important a good, forward-looking and well-thought-out asylum and migration policy would be, one that is based on the rule of law and international agreements, the Ampel government allowed itself to be carried away, gradually abandoning its correct approaches: Abandoning it in favour of a restrictive policy based on deterrence and discrimination, repeatedly threatening to violate laws, the constitution, international conventions and other values and foundations of politics. This 180-degree turn was made manifest, for example, by the approval of the reform of the Common European Asylum System (CEAS) in May 2024: an all-time low for the EU, which will in future even allow children in border procedures at the external borders to be detained.

The „ampel“ started as progressive governing coalition, it has introduced a few improvements with the right of residence and facilitated naturalisation. But at the (early) end of its term in office, the record on refugee protection is bitter: important and progressive plans from the coalition agreement, such as family and sibling reunification, as well as the abolition of ‘Duldung light’ and work bans, have not been implemented. Instead, a lot of time and energy has been invested in tightening the rules – often driven by the increasingly radical statements of the far right...”

TEXT ON THE MASS DEMONSTRATIONS IN GERMANY (BEFORE THE ELECTIONS IN GERMANY)

„This article was written by the We'll Come United coordination group, the Anti-Racism Working Group of interventionistische Linke – Leipzig, and the TMC. In the weeks before the German federal elections (23rd of February) many people took to the streets to protest the rise of the far-right and the possibility of an alliance between the AfD (Alternative für Deutschland) and the centrist-liberal parties. As all the major parties in Germany are moving more and more to the right, the racist attacks on migrants' freedom and

living conditions are really what they seem to have most in common. As the article shows, racist policies and tightening of migration laws are not only part of the political agenda of center-right or far-right parties, but have been common currency also with the allegedly “progressive” government. The huge demonstrations that invaded the streets are an important signal against the leaning of politics to the right. But they will fail to radically change the political trajectory if they don’t address the systemic institutional racism and if they don’t put migrants’ struggles at the forefront. At the same time, Germany is not an isolated case, since racist, patriarchal, and neoliberal policies are becoming the dreadful reality everywhere under this world war scenario. Therefore, a transnational response is more urgent than ever...”


REFUGEE COUNCIL LOWER SAXONY: SHARP CRITICISM OF CHARTER DEPORTATIONS TO IRAQ

On Monday, 17 February 2025 at 9:20 a.m., almost 50 Iraqi nationals were deported from Hannover Airport. In the days before, numerous Iraqis had been taken into detention and custody pending departure in several federal states. In the project ‘Advice in Detention’, the Refugee Council of Lower Saxony was in contact with six affected prisoners and their relatives, including a Yazidi man from Sinjar. The organisation strongly criticises the deportation and denounces it as an expression of a brutalised asylum debate. (...) ‘What we have experienced in the last few days in advising Iraqi deportation prisoners leaves us stunned and angry. We have met people who have made every effort in Germany for years and fought for a chance. Their deportation tears them away from the social and family environment they have built up in Lower Saxony. Many of those seeking advice not only have no family or other ties in Iraq, but also fear concrete impoverishment, immiseration and, in the worst case, the continuation of the persecution they fled from...”

The deportation figures for 2024 were published in response to a „small request“ from the left in the Bundestag.

The total number of 20,084 is significantly higher than in the previous year, but only just below the pre-coronavirus level.

There were 5,827 Dublin transfers; removals to the country of origin (and third-country removals, e.g. of recognised refugees) 14,257. (...) The main target countries for

removals to the country of origin were Georgia, North Macedonia, Turkey, Albania and Serbia.

7,324, or about half of all deportations to the country of origin, were carried out by means of a collective charter (a total of 162 measures), which is significantly more than just a few years ago. In addition, 426 people were transferred to other EU countries in 53 charter measures.

Frankfurt remains by far the most important airport for deportations (6,342 deportations).

After being handed over to the federal police, 1,150 deportations failed. The main reasons for this were refusal of the airline to take the deportees (342 cases), passive resistance (214 cases) and refusal of the federal police to take charge (106 cases).

ECHOES NO. 16: COMMEMORATIONS AND MORE



Commemorations took place on February 6 across dozens of cities in Europe and North and West Africa. Relatives of the disappeared participated in many meetings and demonstrations to commemorate their missing loved ones and to condemn the deadly EU border regime. For more than thirty years, the direct or indirect violence of border regimes has continued to cause death and disappearances along migratory routes. Shipwrecks occur in succession,

often marked by the lack of assistance and, at times, the active involvement of Coast Guards and Frontex. The number of people disappearing without a trace, either at sea or in the desert, keeps increasing. For more than thirty years, families and all those fighting for equal mobility rights have continuously demanded truth and justice for these victims. In coming mobilizations to commemorate 10 years of the summer of migration and of the starting of the civil fleet, we should amplify and give visibility to these voices. ...

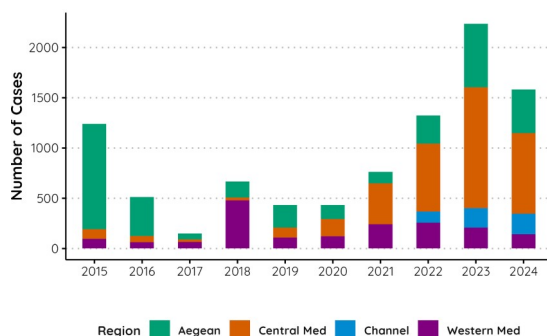

ALARM PHONE: HALF-YEAR REPORT CENTRAL MEDITERRANEAN

Deaths and Repression but also Solidarity and Struggle in the Central Med

„In the second half of 2024, Alarm Phone was alerted to 482 boats in distress in the central Mediterranean Sea. In the whole of 2024, we worked on 803 distress cases in this re-

gion. This is the second highest annual figure for the central Mediterranean Sea, following the record year of 2023, when we were alerted to 1,203 cases. Overall, arrivals via Libya and Tunisia to Europe decreased in 2024, down from about 157,600 people in 2023 to approximately 66,600 people.



Many have tried to cross the sea but did not succeed. This is also due to mass interceptions carried out by Libyan and Tunisian authorities who receive continuous support by Europe. In the past year, new deals were concluded between the EU, its member states, and authoritarian forces in Tunisia and Libya, often to specifically increase interception

capacities. According to IOM, 21,762 people were intercepted at sea and forcibly returned to Libya. Following an estimate by the Tunisian Forum for Economic and Social Rights (FTDES), between 60.000-80.000 people were intercepted at sea by Tunisian authorities and returned there, often to be forced into the desert to Algeria or Libya. IOM estimates speak of 1,700 deaths and disappearances in the central Mediterranean Sea in 2024. We should make clear, however, that any statistical count of interceptions or deaths and disappearances can only ever be rough estimates that need to be treated with caution.

Despite the ongoing assault on solidarity at sea, the actors of the civil fleet have remained resilient and effective over the past year. According to the Civil Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre, of which Alarm Phone is a member, 12,410 people were rescued by the civil fleet in 2024.

In this analysis, we provide a comprehensive chronology of the second half of 2024 (the first six months were covered here), offering in great detail an account of developments as they unfolded in the central Mediterranean Sea. As nobody else is doing so, we need to create our own archive of migrant struggles, acts of solidarity, and forms of border violence at sea. Also for 2025, we promise to continue in our struggle alongside people on the move. In our daily practice, we struggle against borders, for ferries, not Frontex, and the freedom of movement for all...."

MEDICO INTERNATIONAL ON THE FAILURE OF THE AFGHANISTAN ADMISSION PROGRAMME

How the federal admission programme for particularly vulnerable Afghans became a lesson in bureaucratic inhumanity.

„While the topic of migration and its defence dominated the federal election campaign, the fate of the Afghans left behind by the federal government since the catastrophic withdrawal of NATO in August 2021 has been forgotten. The collapse of the Ampel coalition last autumn also sealed the premature end of the federal admission programme for Afghanistan (BAP).

With the BAP, the German government wanted to offer endangered Afghans 'a piece of hope and the chance of a life in freedom, self-determination and security' in Germany, said Foreign Minister Baerbock when the programme was announced in October 2022. Up to 1,000 people per month were to receive a promise of admission. But from the outset, the BAP fell well short of these promises: after 28 months, only 1,172 people have entered Germany via the BAP, instead of 28,000...."

BORDERMONITORING.EU: THE SITUATION OF UKRAINIAN WAR REFUGEES



Kriegsflüchtlinge aus der Ukraine

Die Richtlinie zum vorübergehenden Schutz und ihre Umsetzung in Osteuropa

Today (4 March 2025) marks the third anniversary of the activation of the EU Temporary Protection Directive. So far, more than four million Ukrainian war refugees have come to the EU and have been granted a residence permit under the directive. About 40 per cent of them have found refuge in Eastern Europe.

Our new report focuses on the living situation of Ukrainian war refugees in Poland, Slovakia, Hungary, Romania, Bulgaria, the Czech Republic and the non-EU country of

Moldova. It also provides a detailed insight into the history of the directive on temporary protection, the process of its initial activation and the subsequent intra-European cooperation. The report shows that a Europe characterised by solidarity and openness, one that acts in the interests of people on the move, is definitely within the realm of possibility.

FROM THE GERMANWIDE MEETING ON ASYLBLG/PAYMENT CARDS IN HANNOVER IN FEBRUARY 2025 - FROM THE FINAL DECLARATION:

'The Asylum Seekers Benefits Act serves as a testing ground for the dismantling of social rights and the establishment of an authoritarian welfare state. It structurally excludes refugees. They are denied equal participation in society. They receive benefits that are below the poverty line, live in unworthy conditions, have limited access to medical care, and work under coercive conditions. The law has existed for more than 30 years and determi-

nes the social life of refugees. It brings the border regime into our neighbourhoods and communities and draws a racist line between people.

The authoritarian rules have been tightened again and again, several times in the last year. The reduced basic benefits now apply for 36 months instead of 18 months. They are up to 22% below the subsistence level. Even medical care is now limited to acute illnesses and pain for three years. The work requirement for 80 cents per hour has been extended. Populist arguments have been used to introduce a discriminatory payment card that further complicates the everyday lives of those affected. Benefits can be completely cancelled for refugees for whom another European country is responsible for their asylum procedure.

The Asylum Seekers Benefits Act reveals an authoritarian welfare state, the entrenchment of which we should absolutely prevent. Instead, we advocate for a society of many, in which social rights and participation apply to all. We can only succeed in this endeavour by creating a germanwide network of solidarity. Therefore, we call on you: Become part of this network!...'

Three years after the last Transborder Summer Camp, we invite you to another camp this summer and ask you to register to participate. We will meet for the 3rd Transborder Summer Camp from 05.08-10.08.2025 at the ZAD close to Nantes, France.

What is the TSC?

The Transborder Summer Camp (TSC) is a camp where many activists from different struggles come together every three years. Already in July 2019 and again in July 2022, several hundred activists from over 100 places met at the ZAD for a week of discussions and debates. The focus of the gathering lies on the practical exchange about daily struggles of solidarity and solidarity structures on all the routes. In the past, people and groups met at the TSC and got to know each other, built new networks, shared tools and learned from and about each other. We want to strengthen our movement by reinforcing our connections and connecting our struggles, this is the main goal of the camp.

Why do we meet?



At a time when fascism is propagated in glaring speeches in institutions as well as in public spaces and repressive, xenophobic and murderous laws against immigration are on the rise, we must build a solid and united resistance together. For this reason this year's TSC is organized under the topic INTER-CONNECTING STRUGGLES. We want to emphasize the need to establish links between the various groups involved in struggles for social justice, between the

first concerned, between migrants and autonomous groups. We will meet to exchange ideas about our struggles, to learn from each other, to share our tools and together form a transcontinental network of solidarity.

We are serious about building a movement and infrastructures for the freedom of movement and equal social rights for all. We are serious about making a change, this is our only option! Big words, you say? Maybe, but if things are to change, we can only put them in motion together.

Concretely, this means that we will focus on connections and differences between our struggles as well as individual strategies, and less on presenting our groups and networks. There will be a chance to get to know each other, but the main program will focus

on the (same) big challenges that are shared by those struggling for the freedom of movement, the right to stay, the resistance against structural racism and against the increasing fascism. How can we confront, fight against and undermine in order to achieve equal rights for everyone in a transnational context?

Who is invited?

Along the theme INTERCONNECTING STRUGGLES, everyone who deals with or works to dismantle the different facets of structural racism in one way or another is invited to join. The camp seeks to connect different angles of the same anti-racist struggle and to contribute to the empowerment of self-organized groups, e.g. migrant (refugee) groups or groups of people who experience racism. For this reason their presence at TSC 2025 is a priority. (...)
