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DEAR FRIENDS.



Am Last Sunday (30 March 2014) afternoon, the solidarity group 'Community for All' once again organised a 'prison tremor' in front of the deportation prison in Darmstadt-Eberstadt. There was no major mobilisation, but about 50 people gathered in front of the wall, with a music and loudspeaker system that was used in the beginning to greet the detainees and announce a telephone number. The response

from inside came immediately, with loud shouts from the window cracks, which, despite being barred, are built in such a way that they cannot really be opened. But the internees have their mobile phones, so they can call the number given and then turn it up loud. This results in a remarkably clear and lively communication between the inside and the outside: the background and problems of detention are described, contacts for further counselling are exchanged, music requests are transmitted, which are then immediately played. At some point, small notes with demands and a thank you are stuck in many of the window slits...

The example from Darmstadt is perhaps symbolic of the times. The prison with the wall and the high fences symbolises the migration policy that is currently being discussed in Berlin by the coalition government, which is made up of the conservative party and the social democrats. The policy is set to further tighten the country's immigration laws. '[...]

In coordination with our European neighbours, we will also carry out rejections at the common borders for asylum applications [...],’ the leaked document of the negotiations between CDU/CSU and SPD states quite unabashedly.

Suspension of family reunification, starving asylum seekers in Dublin procedures, Tunisia on the list of safe countries of origin, options for withdrawing German citizenship...: the walls are getting higher and higher, the barbed wire sharper and sharper. The protest action against this seems weak, at least on the defensive, and yet its existence and persistence makes a difference: those unjustly imprisoned are not forgotten, and no legal means will be left untried to stop the planned deportations. An unspectacular Sunday afternoon with the nevertheless significant common message: „We will not give up fighting for our rights. We remain in solidarity. The deportation prison should be demolished...”



And this could be applied to almost all regions of Europe and their externalized borders. In Poland, the complete suspension of the right of asylum is intended to legalise push-backs, while people on the move repeatedly make their way through the forests with the help of solidarity groups. In Libya, a pogrom atmosphere prevails against all black people – fuelled by the so-called government and militias – while the self-organisation of refugees in Libya and supporters tirelessly bring the voices and demands of those



affected to the public and document the human rights violations with a hotline, offering at least consolation. Or in Crete, which is increasingly becoming a point of arrival for people who set out for Europe from eastern Libya, who are left there without adequate care by the institutions, while civil groups are trying to provide a welcome and information for onward travel.

From Darmstadt to Crete – it is and remains this everyday resistance that has become entrenched or even multiplied on the routes and in the places of arrival. Or that is constantly being revived against repression, against powerlessness and despair. This resistance forms the underground for more offensive actions, as they are slowly taking shape in a transnational chain of protests for September 2025. And it keeps the collective memory alive for times when the border regime can be undermined or overrun again on a larger scale. The corresponding slogan remains: No border is forever.

DRASTIC OUTBREAK OF RACIST VIOLENCE AGAINST BLACK PEOPLE IN LIBYA

Drastic outbreak of racist violence against Black people in Libya

Press Release from Refugees in Libya - 20 March 2025



After hateful agitation against Black migrants and refugees by government officials, Black people in Libya are experiencing an outbreak of racist violence, human rights abuses and discrimination.

Between March 12th and 16th, raids, mass arbitrary arrests, assaults, murders and collective expulsions of Black people have been

occurring in Western Libya. The people targeted by this violence are mostly African migrants and refugees, but also Black Libyans and Tunisians. (...)

Up until now, the dehumanization we have seen and experienced in Libya against migrants and refugees has been mostly for profit. EU-supported militias and criminals arbitrarily arrest people in order to enslave them in construction or to work in households and fields. If they refuse or run away, they are mistreated and tortured and their families are forced to pay ransoms. The racist dimension we are witnessing now is a novelty. This violence follows inflammatory hate speech and conspiracy theories propagated by Government of National Unity (GNU) authorities against migrants and refugees, and its motivation is a xenophobic and racist desire to expel all black people from the country. This racist violence colludes with EU goals of “preventing irregular migration” and follows several meetings of the EU ambassador with GNU authorities to discuss “combating human smuggling and border management”. This closeness, and the EU’s silence about the racist violence in Libya, indicates the EU’s tacit encouragement of this violence as long as it serves its anti-migrant objectives.

The extreme violence of these crimes, their scale, the blatant discrimination and their racial motivation make them yet again crimes against humanity. Who is responsible? Refugees in Libya and its Alliance have identified some of those allegedly responsible for these abuses. This is not an exhaustive list, but we wish to see all these individuals brought to court to respond for their criminal actions, either in Libya, in the EU or in The Hague:

- **The Libyan Government of National Unity** holds the highest political responsibility for the crimes committed. In particular, Prime minister Abdul Hamid Dbeibeh and Minister of Interior Emad Al-Trabelsi are personally responsible for spreading dehumanizing hate speech encouraging genocide and ordering the violent attacks.
- **Libyan militias, security forces and warlords** are the direct perpetrators of this violence, as well as failing to prevent racist violence from civilians. Among them, we have identified these actors as main alleged perpetrators:

- The EU-trained Department to Combat Illegal Migration (DCIM) and its head Mohamed al-Khoja
- The Libyan Police, headed by the wanted war criminal recently released by Italy, Osama Elmasry Njeem.
- The RADA Special Deterrent Forces and its head Abdul-Raouf Kara
- Even if most Libyans are peaceful and some have bravely raised their voices in solidarity, **some Libyan civilians** are being complicit in these violent crimes, fire migrants from their jobs, expel them from their homes, and hand over their Black neighbours to the police or even perpetrate the racist violence themselves.
- **The European Union** has been funding, training, equipping and politically supporting the DCIM and other Libyan forces to prevent people from reaching Europe by any means, despite overwhelming evidence that these actors were involved in crimes against humanity. In the last months the EU delegation in Libya has met with GNU and Haftar authorities to agree on further cooperation on anti-migrant action. A communication to the ICC already identified the high-ranking officials implicated. But also mid-ranking officials are instrumental in this criminal cooperation. Two of these officials are:
 - Nicola Orlando, EU ambassador to Libya, who coordinates political and material support to the Libyan criminal actors and refuses to publicly denounce their abuses.
 - Francisco Joaquin Gaztelu Mezquiriz, key European Commission official who has been for years funding the Libyan Coast Guard, DCIM and other criminal actors despite knowing of the crimes they were committing.

The GNU authorities are publicly expressing intent to eliminate all African migrants from Libya and encouraging security forces and civilians to use violence in order to achieve these goals. Civilians and militias are perpetrating this violence, while the EU keeps training, equipping and supporting them. We fear for the lives and safety of our friends and comrades in Libya. We denounce this chain of violence as an ongoing genocide against black people in Libya. Therefore, we call to action to all the actors involved to stop the violence ...“

2-4 MAY IN BERLIN: WE`LL COME UNITED MEETING



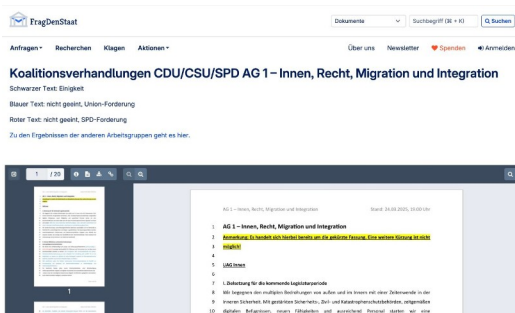

FRAG DEN STAAT: LEAKED DOCUMENT FROM 24 MARCH 2025 ON THE COALITION NEGOTIATIONS REGARDING MIGRATION



Excerpts from the original document of the coalition negotiations between CDU/CSU and SPD:

„... We will end voluntary federal admission programmes as far as possible (e.g. Afghanistan) and will not launch any new programmes.

Suspend family reunification

We will temporarily suspend family reunification for those entitled to subsidiary protection for a period of two years. Hardship cases remain unaffected. After that, we will assess whether a further suspension of the last valid quota solution is necessary and possible in the context of the migration situation.

Migration agreement

We will also conclude more migration agreements to manage legal immigration and ensure the readiness to take back. We will continue to expand the number of migration and repatriation agreements with the relevant countries of origin.

Limiting migration

Refoulement at the state borders

In coordination with our European neighbours, we will continue to turn back asylum seekers at our common borders. We want to take all measures in accordance with the rule of law to reduce irregular migration. Border controls at all German borders are to continue until the external borders are effectively protected and the European Union has fulfilled the existing Dublin and CEAS regulations. We will therefore strengthen the European border protection agency Frontex with regard to border protection and returns.

Extending the list of safe countries of origin

We will extend the list of safe countries of origin and to this end also exploit the possibilities of the CEAS reform. We will start with the classification of Algeria, India,

Morocco and Tunisia. We will continually review the classification of further safe countries of origin. In particular, countries whose recognition rate has been below five percent for at least five years will be classified as safe countries of origin. We want to make it possible for the federal government to classify safe countries of origin by statutory order.

Implementing the CEAS reform

We will transpose the CEAS into national law this year and develop it further at the European level.

Asylum in safe third countries

We want to enable safe and constitutional asylum procedures in safe third countries. Anyone who is to be protected from war and persecution should receive protection, security and adequate living conditions in the third countries. We will apply this model first to persons who are instrumentalised as illegal migrants for Putin's hybrid warfare against Europe. Europe must resolutely oppose this inhumane instrumentalisation of migration as a weapon. To this end, we also support the initiative of the other EU member states to delete the connecting element in European law.

Launching a return offensive and holding countries of origin to account

Rejected asylum seekers must leave our country. We want to provide better support for voluntary return by strengthening incentives and return counselling. If this does not happen voluntarily, the obligation to leave the country must be enforced by the state. This will be done with a coherent approach by the federal government to achieve better cooperation from the countries of origin in all policy areas, including visa issuance, development cooperation, and economic and trade relations. The federal government will develop comprehensive legal regulations to increase the number of returns. In doing so, we will also take secondary migration into account. We will abolish the mandatory provision of legal counsel prior to enforcing deportation. The federal police should be given the authority to apply for temporary custody or departure custody for foreigners obliged to leave the country in order to ensure their deportation. We want to create the possibility of a permanent travel ban for perpetrators of serious crimes who are required to leave the country after serving their sentence, until voluntary departure or deportation occurs. We will also exhaust all possibilities to significantly increase the capacities for custody pending deportation and ensure that the possibilities for detention and custody are designed to be more practical. We want to apply the possibilities for withdrawing the protection status of criminals more consistently. The federal government should continue to support the federal states in obtaining travel documents and implementing returns, and further expand this support. We are centralising responsibility at the federal level for carrying out all transfers under the Dublin or Asylum Migration Management Regulation, thus increasing the number of transfers.

We will deport to Afghanistan and Syria, starting with offenders and persons at risk..."

POLAND DECIDES TO SUSPEND ASYLUM LAW – PRO ASYL: ‘PUSHBACKS BY ANNOUNCEMENT’

„13.03.2025 Today, the Polish Senate approved a law that allows the temporary suspension of the right to asylum. At the border between Poland and Belarus, a large proportion of those seeking protection will no longer be able to apply for asylum. PRO ASYL strongly condemns the unlawful law and calls on the European Commission to put a stop to the brutal pushback practice at the Polish-Belarusian border.

‘Practices that are clearly contrary to European law are being enshrined in law – this is a dangerous development for the rule of law in Europe,’ comments Meral Zeller, policy officer in PRO ASYL’s Europe department. ‘The suspension of the right to asylum is cementing the violent practice of unlawful pushbacks at the Polish-Belarusian border. The law will further exacerbate the suffering of those seeking protection.’

The law clearly violates European and international law. The non-refoulement principle obliges states to always check whether there is a risk of torture or inhumane treatment in the event of deportation or refusal of entry. To be able to rule out such risks, access to fair asylum procedures based on the rule of law must be ensured...”

PRO ASYL: GROUNDBREAKING RULING FROM GREECE – THE END OF THE EU-TURKEY DEAL?



„28 March 2025: In a landmark ruling, Greece's Supreme Court has announced that Turkey is not a ‘safe third country’ for refugees. This has a signalling effect for all of Europe and probably even means the end of the EU-Turkey deal. The ruling should also be taken into account in the German coalition negotiations.

On 21 March 2025, Greece's supreme administrative court overturned the classification of Turkey as a ‘safe third country’. The court made it clear that Greece may not reject asylum seekers from Syria, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Somalia and Bangladesh without examining their individual asylum grounds in the asylum procedure, as has been the case so far, because Turkey is allegedly safe for them. ‘This is a brilliant victory for human rights and will have a positive impact on the future of many people seeking protection, who no longer have to endure uncertainty. The ruling is a clear signal to politicians that they cannot arbitrarily declare third countries to be ‘safe’,’ explains Wiebke Judith, legal policy spokesperson for PRO ASYL.

Refugee Support Aegean (RSA), PRO ASYL's sister organisation, and the Greek Refugee Council have filed a lawsuit against the Greek ministerial decree that the court has now ruled on. For them, the ruling is a complete success. ...”

EL HIBLU 3 - SEARCHING FOR JUSTICE, SIX YEARS ON



„Today, the 28 of March 2025, marks the sixth anniversary of the arrival of the El Hiblu 3 in Malta. Abdalla, Amara, and Kader arrived in Malta in 2019 when they were only 15, 16 and 19 years old. Their journeys had already been long and arduous. Strangers to each other, they had travelled separately over many months from Guinea and the Ivory Coast. In Libya, they witnessed and endured unspeakable violence

that propelled them north in the hope of finding peace and new opportunities to make a life and find safety.

Yet when they arrived in Malta on 28 March 2019, they were met with further violence. Maltese authorities charged them with ‘terrorism’ and hijacking a ship and incarcerated them in Corradino, Malta’s adult prison. Facing such extreme charges, these three young men have steadfastly maintained that they are neither terrorists nor hijackers. Rescued by an oil tanker in the middle of the Mediterranean Sea, they acted as translators and mediators between frightened passengers and crew members.

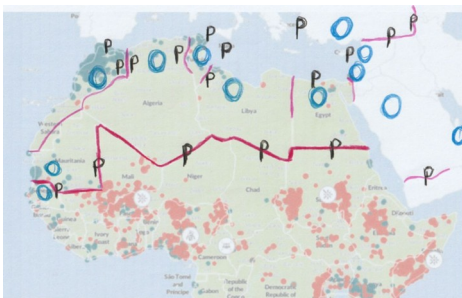
Since then, they have endured a seemingly endless legal process riddled with failures. At the same time, many have supported them in their struggle to clear their names. Last year, the Coalition for the El Hiblu 3 joined with numerous other groups and individuals to celebrate them as Human Rights Defenders for helping to avert an illegal pushback to Libya and for saving lives. President Emeritus Marie-Louise Coleiro Preca presented the young men with their awards, stating “Their bravery and courage have been an inspiration to all Human Rights Defenders across the globe.”

These three young men have endured 2,192 days of unjust criminalisation. When they arrived, they were 15, 16 and 19 years old, now they are 21, 22 and 25. Their youths have been stolen but they still have lives to live. After six years, it is high time to set Abdalla, Amara, and Kader free....”

Three years after the last Transborder Summer Camp, we invite you to another camp this summer and ask you to register to participate.

We will meet for the third Transborder Summer Camp from 05.08-10.08.2025 at the ZAD close to Nantes, France.

What is the TSC?

The Transborder Summer Camp (TSC) is a camp where many activists from different struggles come together every three years. Already in July 2019 and again in July 2022, several hundred activists from over 100 places met at the ZAD for a week of discussions and debates. The focus of the gathering lies on the practical exchange about daily struggles of solidarity and solidarity structures on all the routes. In the past, people and

groups met at the TSC and got to know each other, built new networks, shared tools and learned from and about each other. We want to strengthen our movement by reinforcing our connections and connecting our struggles, this is the main goal of the camp.

Why do we meet?

At a time when fascism is propagated in glaring speeches in institutions as well as in public spaces and repressive, xenophobic and murderous laws against immigration are on the rise, we must build a solid and united resistance together. For this reason this year's TSC is organized under the topic INTERCONNECTING STRUGGLES. We want to emphasize the need to establish links between the various groups involved in struggles for social justice, between the first concerned, between migrants and autonomous groups. We will meet to exchange ideas about our struggles, to learn from each other, to share our tools and together form a transcontinental network of solidarity.

We are serious about building a movement and infrastructures for the freedom of movement and equal social rights for all. We are serious about making a change, this is our only option! Big words, you say? Maybe, but if things are to change, we can only put them in motion together.

Concretely, this means that we will focus on connections and differences between our struggles as well as individual strategies, and less on presenting our groups and networks. There will be a chance to get to know each other, but the main program will focus on the (same) big challenges that are shared by those struggling for the freedom of movement, the right to stay, the resistance against structural racism and against the increasing fascism. How can we confront, fight against and undermine in order to achieve equal rights for everyone in a transnational context?

Who is invited?

Along the theme INTERCONNECTING STRUGGLES, everyone who deals with or works to dismantle the different facets of structural racism in one way or another is invited to join. The camp seeks to connect different angles of the same anti-racist struggle and to contribute to the empowerment of self-organized groups, e.g. migrant (refugee) groups or groups of people who experience racism.
